“ANTIQUES GROVE SHOW” AT HIWAN HOMESTEAD MUSEUM

Do you have some family heirlooms that have been stashed away for years? **What are they worth?** Jefferson County Historical Society has arranged for professional antiques experts to evaluate your antiques and give verbal appraisals. The appraisers have a wide range of expertise including paintings, prints, Native American artifacts, glassware, books, toys, collectibles and more. Special guest Sandy Cooper from Evergreen’s Silver Arrow will evaluate vintage Indian jewelry. So clean out those attics and basements and see just how valuable some of your “junk” may be! The appraisal will be held at Hiwan Homestead Museum on Saturday, June 27, from 10 AM to 4 PM. The fee for **each item** appraised is \$5 **cash** with a limit of 5 items per person. All proceeds from the appraisal will benefit Hiwan Homestead Museum’s programs and activities sponsored by JCHS. The museum will be open for guided tours during the appraisal. Hiwan Homestead Museum, an outstanding example of rustic architecture, is a 25 room log mansion built over a 50-year period from the 1890’s through the 1940’s. It features period furnishings and an outstanding collection of Southwestern Native American artifacts. The museum, located at 4208 Timbervale Drive in Evergreen, is operated through a partnership between Jefferson County Open Space and the Jefferson County Historical Society. It is open from 11 to 5 from Tuesday through Sunday. Except for special tours, admission is free.
