Learn which pioneering lady advocated for Native Americans; mining safety; education; and traveled alone without "fear of man or devil." Come enjoy a fun afternoon and meet these unconventional spirits who became part of the lore of the West on Saturday, April 11 at 1 PM at Hiwan Homestead Museum, 4208 S. Timbervale Dr., Evergreen CO 80439.
