Hiwan Homestead Museum is hosting a Valentine's Tea on **Monday, February 8 at 11:30 A.M.** Please join us for a relaxing lunchtime tea to celebrate the romance of Valentine's Day. A special musical performance by Enchanted Winds, with Liz Hicks-Kimmey, will accompany the tea.

Flutist Liz Hicks-Kimmey is an orchestral, solo, and chamber musician who has played at Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, and Alice Tully Hall. She was accepted to the Denver Chamber Orchestra in 1984 and has performed with the Colorado Symphony Orchestra, Colorado Springs Symphony Orchestra, the Colorado Ballet Orchestra, and the Cheyenne Symphony. She also teaches, and is the Music Coordinator for Enchanted Winds, a series of musical groups that perform in the Denver area. Ms. Hicks-Kimmey will play the flute and will be accompanied by Joan Twedell on the piano.
